



Recycling Textiles and Clothing

Did you know that 95% of all textiles and clothing can be recycled or reused?

Don't put textiles in your trash!

Put them in the Salvation Army Drop Box.

The Salvation Army Drop Boxes at each of the HRMC member Town Transfer Stations accept a wide variety of items:

BEDDING: Sheets, Pillow Cases, Blankets, Comforters, Shams, and Throws

TOWELS and LINENS: Table Linens, Napkins, Table Runners, Kitchen and Bath Towels, Wash clothes, Curtains, Drapes, and Clean Rags

CLOTHING: Jeans, Pants, Shorts, Skirts, Dresses, Shirts, T-shirts, Sweatpants, Sweatshirts, Sweaters, Coats, Jackets, Suits, and Pajamas

ACCESSORIES: Belts, Purses, Ties, and Tote Bags

FOOTWEAR: Shoes, Sneakers, Boots, Flip Flops, and Slippers

The items listed above can be stained, ripped, have broken zippers, missing buttons, but must be clean and DRY. If possible, please place damaged items in a separate plastic bag before putting them in the drop box. Items should be free of solvent and oil stains as they cannot be recycled.

The average person throws away more than ten pounds of used clothing every year. Un-wearable or un-sellable items can be recycled into wiping cloths, insulation, and stuffing.
